

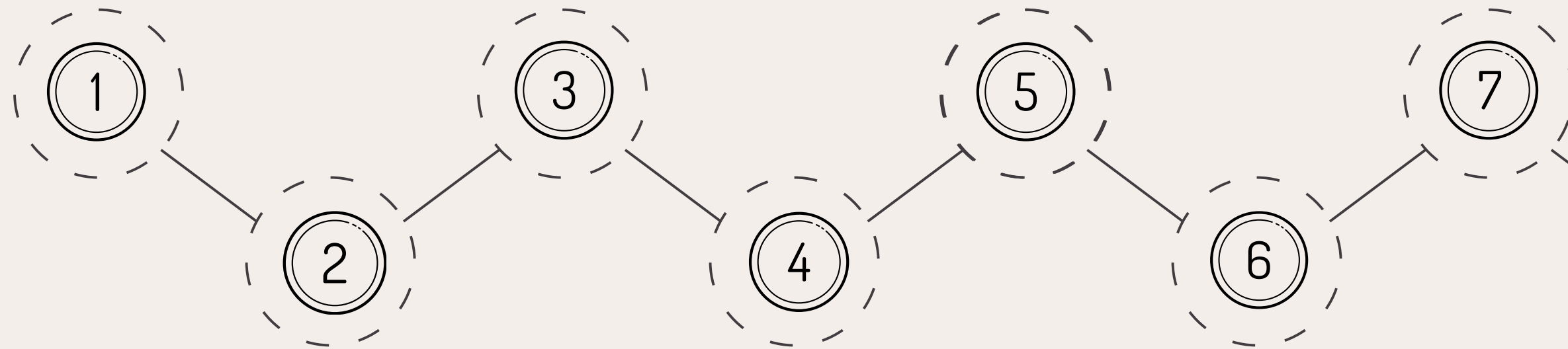
History of The Mungo Foundation

1968
Social Work (Scotland) Act

1980'S
Formation of Archdiocese of Glasgow Community Social Services - increased demand for residential care services, staff team of 200

1990'S
Incorporation of NHS & Community Care (Scotland) Act 1990; Carers (Scotland) Act 1995; Community Care & Direct Payments (Scotland) Act 1996 into Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968

LATE 1990'S
Current introduction of competitive approaches to service commissioning, design and delivery



1976
First services opened

1980'S
Wholesale transformation programme of deinstitutionalisation: growth of learning disability, mental health services and development of older residential people services, staff team of 400

1990'S
Epidemic of heroin intravenous and poly drug use in Scotland reveals a high level of unmet need and societal harm, requiring models of harm reduction in social care. Mungo Foundation provision of rehabilitation and recovery models evolving: staff team of 600

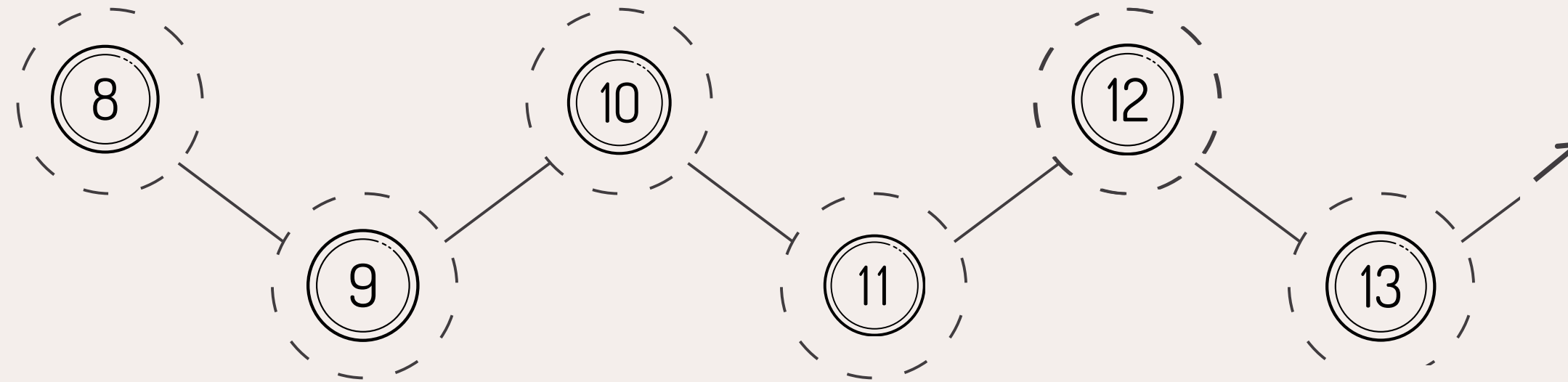
Scottish devolution brings increased commitment to Social Care via policy and law

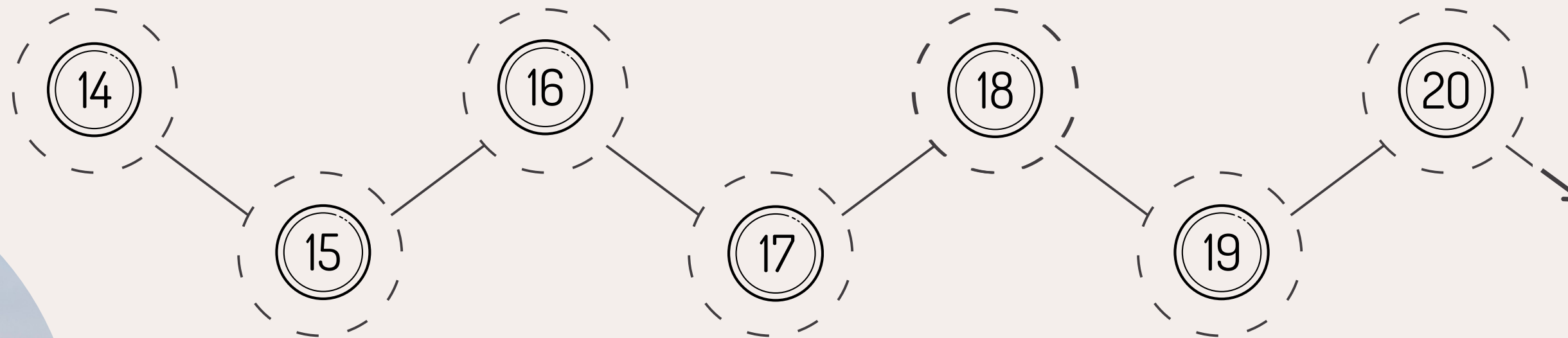
The Mungo Foundation commits to the Glasgow Alliance to End Homelessness
