

# > OUR VISION

Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, the National Centre for Gaelic Language and Culture, provides world-class immersive learning, research and cultural opportunities, which empower our students, staff and partners to champion Gaelic.







2023 marks 50 years of world-class education, research and cultural activity at Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, the National Centre for Gaelic Language and Culture.

The first ever Gaelic short courses took place here in September 1973. Today, we have widened our reach far beyond Skye, attracting thousands of students from Scotland and over 25 other countries worldwide each year. Our 2023-2028 strategy looks at how we will further broaden that reach, and inspire a new generation of confident Gaelic graduates.

From beginners' courses to PhDs; full-time or

part-time study; short courses; on campus or distance learning: Sabhal Mòr Ostaig's courses offer something for everyone.

Immersion education is at the heart of everything we do, as the only centre of tertiary education in the world that provides its learning programmes entirely through the medium of Gaelic.

We are proud of Sabhal Mòr Ostaig's positive contribution to Sleat in the Isle of Skye, where the population has almost doubled since our inception in 1973, and we take great pride in the National Centre for







Welcome to Sabhal Mòr Ostaig's Strategy, 2023-28. Published in our 50th anniversary year, this new strategy builds on the huge achievements of the past and on the current shoots of growth in learning and interest in Gaelic across Scotland and beyond.

Our vision for the next five years is to be a centre of Gaelic excellence, offering world-class immersive learning, research and cultural opportunities, which empower our students, staff and partners to become expert in the Gaelic language and culture and ambassadors for Gaelic.

Sabhal Mòr Ostaig's vision aligns with the vision and aim of the fourth National Gaelic Language Plan, 2023-28: to significantly increase the number of people speaking, learning and valuing Gaelic.

Sabhal Mòr Ostaig will contribute to the National Gaelic Language Plan by:

- delivering Gaelic education in an immersive Gaelic environment, both on campus and via distance learning,
- researching and contributing to scholarship and knowledge exchange in, and about, Gaelic,
- · working in the Gaelic arts,
- being sustainable and self-governing, through the medium of Gaelic,
- and we will achieve this through collaboration with individuals, communities and partners, for the good of Gaelic.

Over the next five years, we will continue to support and help our staff to develop. Highly skilled and enthusiastic, our staff are at the heart of our success as a national centre of learning for our students, and creating our vibrant Gaelic immersive environment for national projects and our partners.

We will update our teaching syllabus and carry out research that benefits Gaelic and Celtic Studies; support national projects, including the Kist o Riches/Tobar an Dualchais, the Dictionary of the Scottish Gaelic Language/Faclair na Gàidhlig, and the Gaelic Place-Names of Scotland project/ Ainmean-Àite na h-Alba. We will support schools and Gaelic Medium Education through our courses for teachers, early years educators and classroom assistants. We will deliver apprenticeships to secondary school students. And we will warmly welcome students throughout the year from all over the world to our extremely popular short courses and distance learning courses.

Our estate environment is extremely important to students and staff especially, but also to our community. We will continue to maintain and upgrade our buildings over the next five years, and we will develop community facilities through, for example, the new housing at Kilbeg. It is a real pleasure, at the beginning of this strategic plan, to see progress with the next phase of the Kilbeg housing development. Kilbeg will create opportunities for so many people who have an interest in Sabhal Mòr Ostaig's mission and who are eager to be a part of it.

With increasing numbers interested in the Gaelic language and culture the world over, the Sabhal Mòr Ostaig Board of Directors looks to the future with confidence that our offering will help the next generation of Gaelic speakers to reach their own potential and contribute positively to the future of the language.



- Reducing carbon emissions and developing energy generation to meet Net Zero requirements




